4 Theme Parks...


Magic Kingdom

If you think of WDW, Magic Kingdom is probably the first place that springs to mind. Quintessential Disney magic everywhere. EPCOT

EPCOT (standing for Experimental Prototype Community of Tomorrow) celebrates the world. Literally. Travel around the World Showcase Lagoon while visiting pavilions of different countries. While there, you can sample their food, culture, purchase items from that country, and maybe even ride a ride or see a show. EPCOT isn't just about World Showcase, however. You can also visit World Nature and handglove over the world or experience the Journey of Water-Inspired by Moana. There's also World Discovery where you might find yourself blasting off to space or becoming a Guardian of the Galaxy; and World Celebration where you can head on a Journey into Imagination.





Disney's Hollywood Studios

Now, where to start? Star Wars? Got it. Toy Story? It's here. Mickey and Minnie? That's here too. Originally meant to show guests how movies are made, Hollywood Studios has progressed a lot since then, and now focuses on putting guests into the movies with some of the greatest theming across property. If you choose to head into Toy Story Land, you'll be shrunk down to the size of a toy in Andy's Backyard. If you head towards Galaxy's Edge, you'll be transported to the planet of Batuu, specifically to Black Spire Outpost, where you'll be able to ride Disney's most immersive ride ever: Star Wars: Rise of the Resistance.



Disney's Animal Kingdom

Animal Kingdom is majestic in its own right. You can go on an actual safari. Need anymore be said? If a safari doesn't take your fancy, how about riding on the back of a banshee or sailing through the Valley of Mo'ara in Pandora: The World of Avatar. Or, how about you take yourself off to one of the theatres and enjoy a Broadway-style show. There's also some massive changes coming to this park, including the introduction of Encanto and Indiana Jones attractions, so stay tuned for updates!



Other Locations...


Disney Springs

Disney Springs is your one-stop-shop for all your shopping and dining needs, whether it be Disney, or not! You'll be able to find all your Disney needs in the massive World of Disney Store, but you're not limited to Disney here. A large quantity of major brands such as Levi's, UNIQLO and Coca-Cola also have locations here. You'll also be spoilt for choice for where to eat when visiting Disney Springs. There are an excessive number of dining options here, catering for a vast range of cuisines; they'll be something for everyone, even those picky eaters (believe me!).



Water Parks

Typhoon Lagoon and Blizzard Beach are the two water parks located at Disney World, but only one will be open at a time (while the other is refurbished). At the water parks, there are attractions for all. From a massive wave pool with colossal waves at Typhoon Lagoon, a slide from the heavens back to Earth at Blizzard Beach and lazy rivers at both. The water parks are great for filling an empty morning or afternoon.



Resorts

When you're visiting Walt Disney World, you have the option to either stay on-property (in a Disney hotel) or off-property. If you opt for staying on-property, you'll be staying in one of Disney's world class resort hotels, each with their own suite of amenities. These range from value resorts (the cheapest) up to deluxe (the most expensive). With 34 separate resorts being listed on Disney's website, I can almost guarantee that there'll be something to suit you and your party! Staying at a resort also comes with its perks. These include being closer to the parks, getting early entry to the parks every morning, free shuttle bus to/from each park to your resort, and more.
